1938 Italy

Italy in 1938 stormed the World Cup, winning for the second time in a row. Their quick attack and impregnable defensive wall dominated play against a field that prefered a slow, measured game in the midfield.

1954 Hungary

Perhaps the best side to not take home the World Cup, the Mighty Magyars of the early 1950s dominated European football. The final against West Germany, dubbed the Miracle of Bern, is considered a World Cup classic.

1958 Brazil

The team that introduced Pele to the World Cup ushered in an era of Brazilian domination on the world's biggest football stage. The semifinal against France was a World Cup classic, and featured Pele as the youngest player to get a hat trick.

1966 England

After his appointment as manager in 1962, Alf Ramsey predicted England would win the 1966 World Cup at home. Though not the clear top-seed, England entered the contest a favorite and brought home the side's first and only to date - World Cup trophy.

1974 Poland

Poland entered the 1974 World Cup as a surprise qualifyer over a strong England team. Poland proved they belonged, overcoming Italy and Argentina in the group stage and leaving the tournament as the third place team over Brazil

1974 West Germany

The West German side was the victim of the first penalty kick ever awarded during a World Cup final. But that was all they allowed Holland in 1974. The host team was clearly the best team of the tournament and would be the first to hoist the newly re-designed trophy.

1982 Brazil

Brazil opened play against a strong Soviet Union side in 1982 and after a few slow starts, Brazil came alive and amazed in their victory over Argentina and, indeed, in their loss to Italy. The 1982 Brazilian side is considered one of the best not to contest a World Cup final.

1986 Argentina

Victors in the tournament that gave birth to the Wave (yes, that Wave), Argentina used the 1986 World Cup as a chance to get even with England for the Falkland War And then Maradona (yes, that Maradona) carried the side to their second title.
