

Peggy Doody: Newspaper Obituary and Death Notice

Peggy Sue Doody, 63, of Spring Grove, died Nov. 23 at the Woodstock Extended Care Center in Woodstock.

Mrs. Doody was born May 7, 1939, in Birmingham, Ala., the daughter of Roy and Burley (Smith) Byers, moving to Lake County, Ill., in 1963. Peggy had worked for the Ball Brothers Corporation of Mundelein for six years, Abbott Laboratories for 2 years, and Anchor Glass Container for 25 years as an inspector and in quality control.
