A dramatic playoff game between the Red Sox and the Indians, both of whom finished the regular season with 96-58 records, highlighted the 1948 campaign. Cleveland whipped Boston in that contest at Fenway Park to conclude an outstanding pennant race in which the third-place Yankees finished just two games back.

The Braves surprised nearly everyone by winning the N.L. flag over St. Louis. Stan Musial, in the finest season of his career, was a one-man gang for the Cards. He hit .376 with 46 doubles, 18 triples and 39 homeruns; he scored 135

runs and knocked in 131.

By 1948 the big leagues had returned to full strength. Players like Joe DiMaggio, Ted Williams and Bob Feller were back in baseball condition, and rosters were stronger than they'd been at least since the very early forties. Ralph Kiner, Johnny Mize, Hal Newhouser and Johnny Sain are just a few of the stars you'll enjoy watching as you replay the 1948 season.

1916 is the first full season from the decade 1910-1919 for which APBA has computed cards. Pitching pretty much dominated the game that summer (both leagues had overall ERA's well under 3.00), but there were a number of exceptional hitters.

Ty Cobb finished second in the A.L. batting race with "only" a .371 mark, for instance. He trailed champion Tris Speaker by a full 15 points! The ill-starred Joe Jackson checked in at .341. Another notorious figure, Hal Chase, averaged .339 to lead the National League.

Among the pitchers, Grover Cleveland Alexander (33-12 with 16 shutouts) was a 30-game winner for the second of three consecutive years. Walter Johnson won 25 for the Senators, but perhaps the best hurler in his league was a young lefty from Boston named Babe Ruth (23-12, 1.75 ERA).

There were 3-team pennant races in both leagues. The Red Sox outlasted the White Sox and Tigers in the American, and the Phillies and Braves couldn't quite catch the Dodgers in the National
