We ask for your patience and your understanding during our busiest time of the year. (After April 30, delivery may take a maximum of six weeks, but probably much less.)

Customers living in Pennsylvania must add 6% sales tax to all prices, and residents of all foreign countries must add 10%. (But APO or FPO addressees pay the regular U.S. prices.)

NEW: TWO MORE OLD BASEBALL CARD SETS FROM APBA

1954 AND 1936

1954

For the sixth consecutive year, the city of New York boasted the champions of baseball. But after five straight seasons at Yankee Stadium, the championship banner flew from the Polo Grounds in 1954 instead.

Oh, the Bronx Bombers had their customary superior season. In fact, they won 103 games, more than they had in any of the preceding five title campaigns. In 1954, though, Cleveland won 111, setting a league record in the process.

But even the Tribe's spectacular year ended on a sour note when the club failed to win a single game against the upstart New Yorkers from the Senior Circuit in the World Series. It was a Series highlighted by the pinch-hitting of Dusty Rhodes and by the play which came to be known simply as "The Catch" by Willie Mays.

Several promising rookies appeared during the 1954 season. Among them were Detroit outfielder Al Kaline, Chicago shortstop Ernie Banks, and a skinny ex-infielder named Hank Aaron who was able to break into Milwaukee's outfield after an injury to Bobby Thomson.

1936

A couple of rookies sparkled in 1936, too. A middle-of-the-pack Cleveland team suddenly began to arouse intense national interest when 17 year-old Bob Feller took the mound in August and fanned 15 batters in his first start. The overpowering teenager recorded 76 strikeouts in just 62 innings of work. (Interestingly, Feller and Phil Cavarretta have cards in both the 1936 and the 1954 sets.)

In New York, the Bronx Bombers unveiled another gem. Joe DiMaggio, only 21 himself, hit .323, rapped 29 homers, scored 132 runs and drove in 125. DiMaggio's club, led by Lou Gehrig's 49 homers and .354 average, won 2/3 of its games and, in the World Series, polished off the same New York team which was to defeat Feller's Cleveland aggregation in the Series eighteen years later.

Luke Appling made a run at the .400 mark, finishing at .388 to win the Junior Circuit's batting title over Earl Averill (.378). Paul Waner took the crown in the other league with a .373 mark, and King Carl Hubbell (26-6) was the class of the pitchers in the majors that year.
