St. Louis Browns of 1944: In normal times, this would not have been considered a great team. But it was a fine wartime club, and, more importantly, it was the only pennant-winner the Browns ever had.

New York Mets of 1969: The "Miracle Mets." They finished 9th in 1968 and became World Champions a year later, providing one of the biggest surprises in baseball history.

Atlanta Braves of 1969: A hard-hitting division champ, these Braves were trampled by the Mets in the League Championship Series. They were the first team to claim a title of any kind in Atlanta.

Baltimore Orioles of 1970: They rolled over American League competition, compiling a 108-54 record. Then they overpowered the Reds in the World Series in just 5 games.

Cincinnati Reds of 1970: The initial edition of the "Big Red Machine" won the Western Division by 14½ lengths. They hit 191 homers, a sign of the hard times ahead for pitchers facing this outfit throughout the '70's.

Pittsburgh Pirates of 1971: A powerhouse in its own right, this club outclassed the N.L. East, roughed up the Giants in the playoffs, then shocked the heavily-favored Orioles in the Series.

San Francisco Giants of 1971: They hung on to beat the hated Dodgers by one game in the Western Division, but it was their last gasp. This was the first Giant team in post-season play since 1962.

Oakland Athletics of 1972: Number one of three consecutive World Champions for the A's. This gutsy group topped the Tigers in the playoffs, then edged the Reds in the Series.

Los Angeles Dodgers of 1974: A young club, and one which would contend for nearly a decade. They outdistanced the Reds to win the N.L. West and whipped the Pirates for the pennant, but couldn't handle the A's.

Boston Red Sox of 1975: After a brilliant regular season, they stunned the A's in three straight in the playoffs. Then they lost to the Reds in perhaps the finest World Series ever played.
