

APBA MAJOR LEAGUE PLAYERS BASEBALL — VERSION 1.5!

Miller Associates has announced version 1.5 of the APBA Major League Players Baseball computer game. This new version features improved screen performance (which makes for more rapid games) and the capability to play the game with data disks installed on your hard drive.

If you want only an upgraded program disk, the price is \$12.00 for registered owners of APBA Major League Players Baseball. (You can't buy a \$12 upgrade from APBA, of course, if you haven't already purchased a previous version of the complete game from us.) If instead you want a complete new game including version 1.5 and the 1990 season data disk, it's \$39.95. Note that the 1990 season data disk (as well as the new 1955, 1969 and 1972 season data disks) include a new, faster version of the "Draft" program. Note that a complete new game is only \$8 less than the combination of the upgrade disk and the 1990 data disk.

APBA Major League Players Baseball, including its system requirements, is described briefly on the back of the flyer headed "APBA Baseball Fan" in blue. The new data disks are advertised there, too.

APBA BASEBALL STATMASTER—A RECORD-KEEPING MARVEL!

APBA Baseball StatMaster, developed by Danny Landers and Miller Associates, enables you to retain statistics from one game or a series and add them to stats you've accumulated previously. You can keep statistics for a 2-game series, a 162-game season or anything in between. The depth of the statistical reports is simply astonishing:

You must have the data disk for the season you are playing in order to use the program. (StatMaster does not include APBA Major League Players Baseball). The program takes the players from the appropriate data disk to begin its record-keeping. That means you cannot use players not represented on a data disk. You can only enter stats; you cannot enter players on your own unless you have Wizard or Innovator (see below). But StatMaster does allow you to edit any of your statistics manually.

APBA Baseball StatMaster sells for only \$49.95 in either 5 1/4" or 3 1/2" IBM format. It is not copy-protected.

The system requirements for APBA Baseball StatMaster are the same as those listed for APBA Major League Players Baseball on the back of the flyer headed "APBA Baseball Fan" in blue.

CREATE APBA BASEBALL "CARDS" WITH THE BASEBALL WIZARD!

With the Baseball Wizard software, you can generate APBA player cards and ratings from raw statistics you input, you can establish new ratings for an existing player, and you can add entirely new players to data disks you own. Wizard is not copy-protected, and it costs \$39.95 in either 5 1/4" or 3 1/2" IBM format.

You can add your college, high school, Little League or any other team, real or imaginary, to a data disk, and you can play that team against other teams you've added or against existing teams on that disk. (A "Wizardized" disk will accommodate 780 players altogether.) You can project "in-progress" cards and ratings based on mid-season stats. You can adjust existing cards, ratings and statistics in any way you wish.

Wizard, published by Miller Associates and developed by Rick Diaz and Ron Mura, is designed to work with APBA Major League Players Baseball. You must own that game and at least one data disk to use Wizard. The hardware required is the same as that for APBA Major League Players Baseball, except that 384K memory and two disk drives are required (two floppies — 5 1/4" or 3 1/2" — or one floppy and a hard drive), as is DOS 3.1 or later. And, naturally, you need to have handy those statistics you wish to enter, stats like games, at bats, hits, doubles, triples, homers, walks and stolen bases for batters; games, games started, wins, losses, saves, innings pitched, earned runs, walks and strikeouts for pitchers; and games, putouts, assists, errors and passed balls for fielders. (The "cards" Wizard creates will not necessarily be identical to cards calculated by APBA Game Co., Inc.)

BROADEN YOUR HORIZONS WITH APBA BASEBALL GENERAL MANAGER!

Published by Computer Sports Network (CSN) of Houston, Texas and developed by Miller Associates, APBA Baseball General Manager provides an "on-line" environment for APBA Major League Players Baseball, the APBA computer baseball game. Now you can own a franchise in a realistic and totally electronic environment. Briefly, here's how General Manager works:

- Obtain your user identification number with a single phone call to the CSN host computer (1-800-727-4636).
- Log-on to CSN with just a few keystrokes.
- Seconds later, examine a list of leagues with openings for owners.
- Request a franchise, name a team, and it's yours.
- Download and study the list of players eligible for the formation draft (you can make trades later on).
- Compete for the best players in the draft by submitting draft lists for each round — through your modem, of course. (CSN has 1200 baud modems available for \$99.00. Call the toll-free number above for information).
- Play 5 games per week (usually "home" and "away" weeks alternate) toward a complete 162-game schedule drawn up and monitored by CSN.
- Short seasons and old season re-draft leagues also available.

With General Manager, you don't need to use the mail at all. Everything is accomplished electronically. Current on-line charges (subject to change) are as follows: \$0.60/minute prime time (7 a.m. - 6 p.m.); \$0.15/minute non-prime time (6 p.m. - 7 a.m., weekends and holidays). There is a 2 minute minimum charge per log-on. All times are your local time. There is a \$40 maximum monthly charge for up to two organizations for non-prime time use. (Some time limitations apply.) CSN's toll-free number is available for technical support.

And now General Manager includes Advanced Player Management! That means a GM-league manager must monitor his player usage very carefully. A tired player may not perform as well as he normally would, and will be more susceptible to injury. On the other hand, a player who sees too little action will probably also perform below expectations when he is finally called upon. Advanced Player Management adds still another element of realism to the role of an APBA manager in GM's on-line leagues.

To run General Manager, you must first own APBA Major League Players Baseball and APBA Baseball StatMaster in IBM format. (Neither of these is included in General Manager.) You'll also need an IBM PC, PC/XT, PC/AT, PS/2 or true compatible with minimum 640K RAM, a 5 1/4" or 3 1/2" floppy drive AND hard drive, DOS 3.1 or later and a Hayes-compatible modem.

APBA Baseball General Manager is priced at \$49.95 (\$52.95 Pa., \$54.95 foreign), and it is not copy-protected.

CHANGE "CARD" NUMBERS & MUCH MORE WITH APBA BASEBALL INNOVATOR!

APBA Baseball Innovator, developed by Rick Diaz and Miller Associates, displays APBA card numbers, names, Master Game symbols, fielding ratings, pitching grades and real-life statistics for any player on a data disk. More importantly, Innovator allows you to change them! This feature is especially appealing to fans who enjoy tinkering with APBA's assigned ratings and card numbers.

Innovator costs \$44.95 in 5 1/4" or 3 1/2" IBM format. It is not copy-protected and its system requirements are identical to those for APBA Major League Players Baseball.

MILLER ASSOCIATES PRESENTS DUERK'S BASEBALL ANALYST!

Duerk's Baseball Analyst is something entirely new. It is neither a game nor a simulation, and it has nothing directly to do with APBA Major League Players Baseball, although it will certainly provide you with an astonishing amount of information about the ballplayers in the game. Duerk's Baseball Analyst is, in fact, an informational product, much like an encyclopedia.

This initial version includes career records for all players active during the 1990 season. Seasonal updates and past-player historical record sets are planned for the future.

You can view a player's stats in an Encyclopedia Format (which includes many more statistics than can ever be presented cost-efficiently in any printed volume), a Single-Year Format (which enables you to observe his one-year performance on one screen) or a Matrix Format (which provides a "3-dimensional" display of over 225 calculations for each year of a player's career with a maximum of more than 6000 calculations). And you can print anything you can display with Duerk's Baseball Analyst, if you have enough paper.

Nearly every conceivable statistic, traditional or contemporary, is available, including counters (HR, strikeouts, etc.), calculations (batting average, ERA, etc.) and complex evaluations (total average, runs created, etc.).

A Comparison Module evaluates any two players. Single seasons, career totals or seasonal totals may be selected for comparison in 54 pitching and 47 batting or fielding categories. In Duerk's Baseball Analyst, fielding stats are included under batting. Each Leader Board displays the best or worst players for any category you choose.

In a unified data base, Duerk's Baseball Analyst furnishes comprehensive career profiles of all 1990 season players, profiles previously available only by tedious manual compilation from various reference sources. Calculations which might otherwise take months of research are completed here in seconds.

For the APBA manager, Duerk's Baseball Analyst offers an incredibly thorough and concise method for examining a player's performance and perhaps determining his worth as a prospective draftee or as someone you might consider trading or trading for.

Duerk's Baseball Analyst costs \$49.95. It requires an IBM or true compatible computer with at least 640k RAM, a 3 1/2" or 5 1/4" floppy drive AND A HARD DISK, an EGA or VGA color monitor (an EGA monitor must have 256k video memory) and DOS 3.1 or later.
