They beat a veteran Cleveland club and a rising Pittsburgh team in the playoffs, and then, remarkably, found Joe Namath, Dick Butkus, Leroy Kelly, Mike Ditka, John Riggins, rookie themselves underdogs for the Super Bowl.

But they silenced all doubters by utterly dominating George Allen's "Over-the-Hill Gang" in the finale, and won the game 14-7 in spite of Garo Yepremian's infamous pass attempt after a blocked field goal.
