But the play had been correctly analyzed and instead of a touchdown, seven yards resulted. The Browns were stopped on the two yard line. What a finish! As stated before, mearly every game has been like the above. I can honestly say I have never played a boring game of APBA Football—in fact, my experience leads me to believe it's an impossibility.
